## END OF YEAR 2023 REPORT FROM EDUCATION DEPARTMENT Introduction

Lira City Council is located in Lango Sub region, Northern Uganda. It has fourty four government aided primary schools, six government aided Secondary Schools, two government aided tertiary Institution that is Lira School of Nursing and Midwife and Uganda technical college Lira and we public university. Eighty five private primary schools, 142 Early Childhood development centre, eight health Institutions, Four University teachers training Institutions and three private university. Although there are some Institutions which are not registered and operating illegally.

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## Methodology

The methods used includes:-

- Observation
- Checking school records
- Interviews
- Post observation conference within Headteachers, SMC, and PTA

- Photography among others.

#### School monitoring meeting at the City level

This exercise was carried out in all schools within Lira City.

#### They were:-

- Nursery Schools and Kindergartens
- Primary Schools
- Secondary Schools
- Tertiary Institutions
- Universities

These schools were monitored and checked to find the level of compliance to the existing laws mainly;

- The Education act 2008
- The Financial and accounting act.
- The Government Standing Order
- Teachers professional Code of conduct.
- The Children's act

The level of teacher's performance was fairly good.

Although teachers performance is low in the peri urban areas of the annexed subcounties.

This is majorly related to laxity from the school administration.

This was witnessed in the following schools;

- 1. Iwal primary school
- 2. Cura primary school
- 3. Acwikot primary school
- 4. Owinyo primary school
- 5. Lira Parents primary school

In some of these schools teachers have continued to fail to complete syllabus for example Owinyo primary school where P.7 teachers did not complete the syllabus for P.7 candidates who sat for PLE 2023.

Remedial lessons were not taught in some of these schools.

Teacher's absenteeism is a challenge in the annex sub counties where learners have continence to perform poorly in classes.

Pupil's absenteeism is a challenge coupled with very high level of school drop out.

TELA is being used in government aided schools although private schools could not pick up since phones prescribed to be bought are not there in the open market.

#### Objectives of the monitoring exercise

The main objective of the exercise was to find out the level of teacher learners achievement a cross schools.

- To find out whether Inspectors of schools have supported teaching and learning in schools.
- To check the level of syllabus coverage accross schools.
- To find out whether teaching and learning is going on well in schools.

Teachers attitude is a challenge in these schools, they want to be forced to do the work.

Headteachers in some of these schools are relaxed.

#### **Success Stories**

The majority of schools finished the syllabus in time.

Schools feeding program has taken shape in private schools.

The level of schools inspection and support supervision has dramatically improved.

Uganda heart Institute has screened learners in schools on Rheumatic heart diseases where 367 students were found to be positive with the disease and referred for care and treatment.

Learners were also screened in sickle cell where many were found to be positive.

We had a training camp for primary seven candidates for 2023 in two phases where learners were supported in question and answer approach.

The level of teacher's commitment has improved.

## **Summary of field findings**

The following external examinations were conducted successfully;

PLE from 8<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> November 2023

Uganda Certificate of Education

This was carried out from 14th October 2023 to 17th November 2023.

Uganda Advance Certificate of Education

This was carried out from 13<sup>th</sup> November 2023 to 1<sup>st</sup> December 2023.

Uganda Business and Technical Education

This was carried out from 20<sup>th</sup> November 2023 to 1<sup>st</sup> December 2023 in 20 centers National Diploma.

This was carried out from 1<sup>st</sup> December 2023 to 19<sup>th</sup> December 2023 in 8 centers

#### **Emergency issues**

Teacher's commitment is affected by bad comments from UNATU leaders within Lira City Council which discourages teachers from working hard.

There are some few teachers in Lira Town College and Lango College

Who have continued to perform below standards, this has affected the quality of Education in the two schools. There is need for immediate intervention on this vice so that does not migrate to other government schools. There is a group of parents within the City who use the radio stations to demobilize parents from supporting children in schools.

## Significant findings

From the school monitoring exercise the following issues were found to have contributed highly in poor performance in Lira City Council schools.

- Teacher's attitude towards teaching and learning in schools is bad.
- Some teachers are still teaching using the old text books and curriculum and teaching topics which are not examinable by UNEB.
- Reading and writing is a very big challenge in both private and government schools. A child who does not know how to read and write cannot pass PLE.

- Some Headteachers have the I do not care attitude where they pay attention to the quality of education in schools.
- Poor planning and budgeting a cross schools by Headteachers.
- Poor syllabus coverage.
- Poor assessment system, where there is no continuous assessment.
- Headteachers who fear teachers who do not want to work especially in secondary schools where these teachers are UNATU leaders.
- Lack of school feeding programs in schools.
- Poor parental support in schools.
- Lack of school inspection and monitoring of schools.
- Lack of subject content by teachers.
- Teachers who have not studied in O'level and borrowed papers of relatives.
- Both internal and external examinations ended well.
- Some teachers discourage their colleagues not to work

#### Challenges gaps

- Lack of essential text books in schools.
- Poor parental involvement in school management
- Lack of supervision from SMC's and PTA executives.
- High level of teachers and pupils absenteeism in schools.
- Secondary school teachers who have overstayed in schools and they think they cannot be transferred.
- Inadequate desks, toilets, classrooms, text books and other facilities in schools.
- High charges in schools.
- Abandonment and abscondment of duties by teachers.
- Few teachers in schools compare to high enrolment leading to high work load a cross schools.
- Some teachers are teaching wrong facts
- Teachers are teaching subject competencies leaving language competencies
- Some Teachers in secondary schools especially Lango College and Lira Town College have no respect for Education office and Lira City council staff

#### Recommendations

- Recruit more teachers to match the high enrolment in schools and offset the high work load.
- Secondary school teachers who have overstayed should be transferred.
- NGO called ICYD Usaid must streamline their activities and incorporate in departmental plan.
- Need for continuous capacity building and training of teachers

- Guidance and counseling department to be supported in schools.
- Need to sensitize learners on the effect of drugs in schools and the society.
- Teachers who abandoned duty should be presented to service commissioner for action.
- Secondary School teachers who have overstayed in one school should be recommended for transfer.
